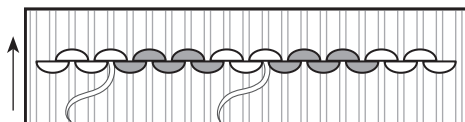

MULTIPLE NEEDLE TECHNIQUE

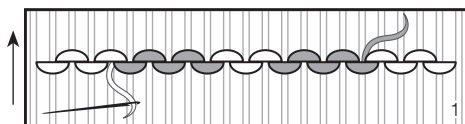
Step by step, pg. 20 - 21

The diagrams have the incorrect thread positions shown.

The correct positions are as follows.

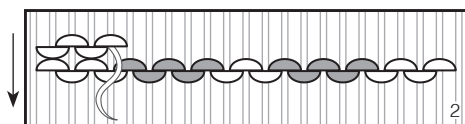


1. Take the second needle of light colour to the back, skip four pleats on the back and bring it out at the front. Stitch four cables.

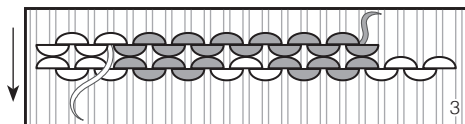


2. Straighten all your stitches. Now take all the dangling threads and needles through to the back of the fabric (at exactly the same point they came through to the front).

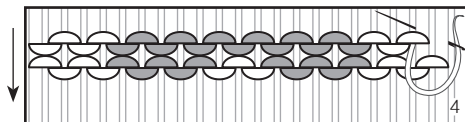
Turn your work upside down. Bring the first colour needle to the front (remember to start the row correctly). Work four cables starting with an under cable and ending with an over cable. Leave the thread hanging on the front.



3. Bring your second colour to the front at the same spot and stitch thirteen cables starting and ending with an under cable. Leave the needle and thread hanging from the front.



4. Bring the first colour back to the front at this point and stitch four cables starting with an over cable. You will be decreasing the large heart by one pleat at each end, so take the needle through two pleats at the final under cable, emerging as shown.

Insert

The cutting information should read:

Cut insert strip the depth of guide PLUS

1.5cm ($\frac{5}{8}$ ") on both edges top and bottom.

eg. Say you have 8 rows to smock, 8 rows covers 7cm ($2\frac{3}{4}$ ")

Add 1.5cm ($\frac{5}{8}$ ") top

Add 1.5cm ($\frac{5}{8}$ ") bottom

Total 10cm (4") deep.

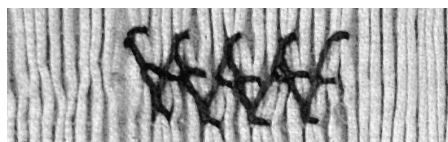

Blocking guide, pattern sheet

The front guide is too wide. You will need to delete 1.5cm ($\frac{5}{8}$ ") from the centre front and side seams. The blocking measurement given for the smocking is correct (27cm – 10 $\frac{5}{8}$ ").

Issue 26

CLEMENTINE

Graph, pg. 40

An error occurred in the graph.

The smocking design for the top and bottom border rows, and for the sleeve, should be 7 cable-wave combination, not 5 cable-wave combination as shown.

BABY LOVE

Pattern sheet

The front button band pattern piece is not long enough.

Please add 2cm ($\frac{3}{4}$ ") for newborn, 2.5cm (1") for 6 months and 3.5cm (1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ") for 12 months to the front button band.

Colour Key, pg. 39

The colour key for this dress is incorrect.

It should read:

A = 0901 lt blue-violet

B = 0902 med blue-violet

C = 1309 lt green (3 skeins)

D = 1311 dk green

Pattern, sheet 2 side 1 – Errata on pg. 10

The armhole template for shaping the back skirt is missing from the pattern sheet.

Before attaching the back skirt, mark the armhole shaping using the template and cut away the excess fabric.

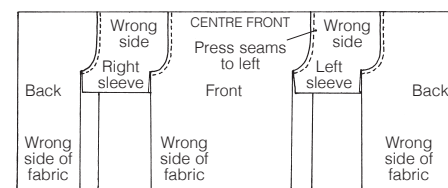
Gather the upper edge of the back skirt and attach following step 9 for *Unforgettable*.

The front and back have been incorrectly labelled on the diagram. The correct labels are shown below.

The notation on the neck binding pattern piece should read **CUT 1 on bias**, NOT **on fold**

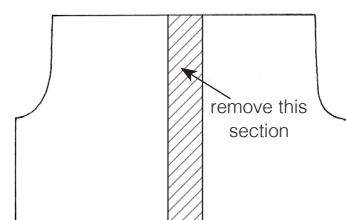
THE FLOWER SELLER

Pattern, sheet 1 side 1

Sleeve (pattern piece 3)

Make the following adjustments to the sleeve pattern piece for sizes 8 and 10, to allow these sizes to be cut from the fabric requirements given.

Fold the sleeve through the centre to remove a section from the width, 6cm ($2\frac{3}{8}$ ") for the size 8, and 7cm ($2\frac{3}{4}$ ") for the size 10.

Then use the cutting layout on the next page to cut out the pieces.

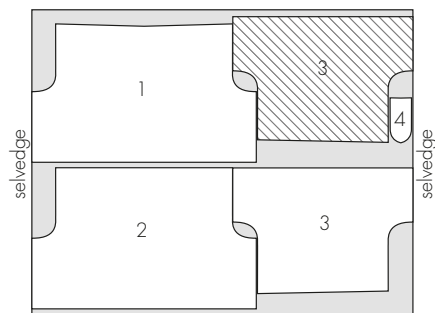

Requirements, pg. 12

Insert

The width of the panel for the smocked insert is insufficient for the number of pleats required. The white cotton poplin piece should be 13cm x 80cm wide (5" x 31 1/2").

Pattern, sheet 2 side 1

There is an error in the back pants pattern piece for this garment. The back inner leg seam is too long and will not match the front inner leg seam. To ensure that the pattern pieces fit together, you need to cut the crotch on the back pants pattern piece down lower.

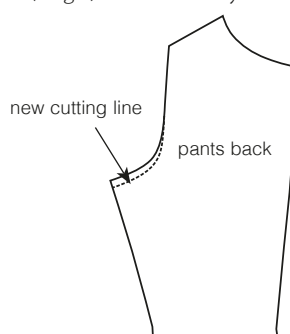
To do this measure down from the top of the back inner leg seam, the specified distance and mark:

Size 12 months: 29mm (1 1/8")

Size 18 months: 27mm (1 1/16")

Size 24 months: 22mm (7/8")

Then redraw the crotch curve from the marked point (*diag 1*) and trim away the excess.

Requirements, pg. 40

The requirements for the Christmas red mini piping are incorrect and should be as follows: 1.8m (1yd 35").

PETITE FLOWER

Requirements, pg. 14

The requirements for the strawberry pink mini piping are incorrect and should be as follows: 1.7m (1yd 30").

Pleating, pg. 8

The required number of pleats for the front and back skirts should be:

Front: 74 pleats for each front

There is an error in the measurement for the insert. It should read:

Rectangle for smocked insert: cut one, 9cm x 112cm wide (3 1/2" x 44") for all sizes.

The colour key down the side of the graph is incorrect. It should read:

Rows 6 - 9 = A 2323

Rows 10 - 11 = B 2333

Step by step, pg. 43

There is an error in the measurement provided in box 1. It should read:

Measure 30cm (11 3/4") from the lower raw edge and mark at one side seam.



Issue 67

LAVENDER LANE

Embroidery, sheet 3 side 1 – Errata on pg. 10

The embroidery design and sash template were omitted from the pattern sheet.

HOME SWEET HOME

Construction, sheet 2 side 2

There is an error in the instructions.

They should read:

Complete step 6 after step 10.

Step 7 - Making the hem tucks

On the wrong side, fold the raw edge of the hem up to the marked second line. This will enclose the hem within the tuck.

GUARDIAN ANGELS – GABRIELLE

Preparation and Pleating, pg. 36

There is an error in the instructions for unpicking the neckline pleats.

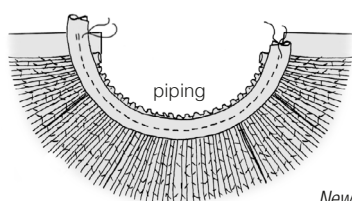
They should read: Unpick the pleating threads for 4cm (1 1/2") on the left back opening and 6cm (2 3/8") on the right back opening.

Construction, sheet 3 side 1

The construction diagrams were incorrect at the time of printing.

3. Piping the neckline

Pin the piping around the neckline with the corded edge of the piping just above the top row of smocking and allowing 1cm (3/8") extending at each end. Tack in place and stitch along the piping stitchline (*diag 5*).



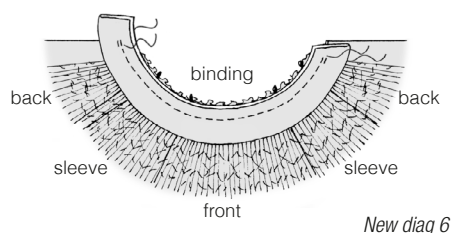
Remove the cord from the extension at each end of the piping.

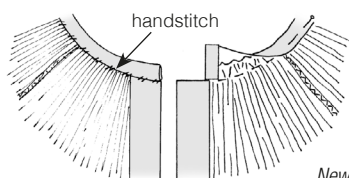
4. Binding the neckline

With wrong sides together, fold the binding in half along the length and press. Matching raw edges and with 1cm (3/8") extending at each end, pin the doubled binding to the neckline. Stitch along the previous piping stitchline (*diag 6*).

Stitch again 4mm (3/16") from the previous stitchline. Trim very close to the second row of stitching. Fold in the extended ends of the binding and piping, tucking the ends of the piping into the seam allowance. Fold the binding over the seam to the wrong side. Pin the binding in place with the pressed edge concealing the previous stitching. To avoid wrinkles in the neck binding, ensure the binding is firmly wrapped over the seam. Handstitch the binding in place using small, close stitches (*diag 7*).



GUARDIAN ANGELS – RAPHAEL

Construction, sheet 3 side 1

This construction diagram was incorrect at the time of printing.

9. Finishing

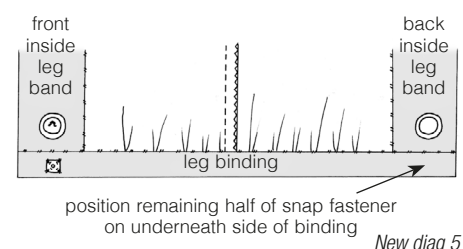
Stitch two snap fasteners, just behind the smocking on the right hand side and on the button band on the left back to correspond.

GUARDIAN ANGELS – RAPHAEL

continued

Stitch a tiny button loop on the right back on the neck binding and attach a button on the left back neck binding to correspond. Stitch two buttonholes at 4cm (1 1/2") intervals below the smocking on the right back to correspond. Attach two buttons on the left back to correspond.

Following the manufacturer's instructions, evenly space and attach seven popper studs to the inside leg bands. The front overlaps the back. Attach a snap fastener aligning it with the centre of the popper stud on the leg binding (*diag 5*).

The measurements provided for the gusset are incorrect. The correct measurements are:

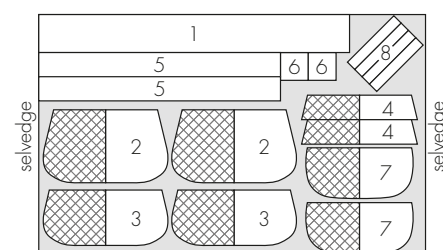
Gusset: cut two, each 7cm x 70cm (2 3/4" x 27 1/2")

Gusset: cut one 7cm x 70cm (2 3/4" x 27 1/2")

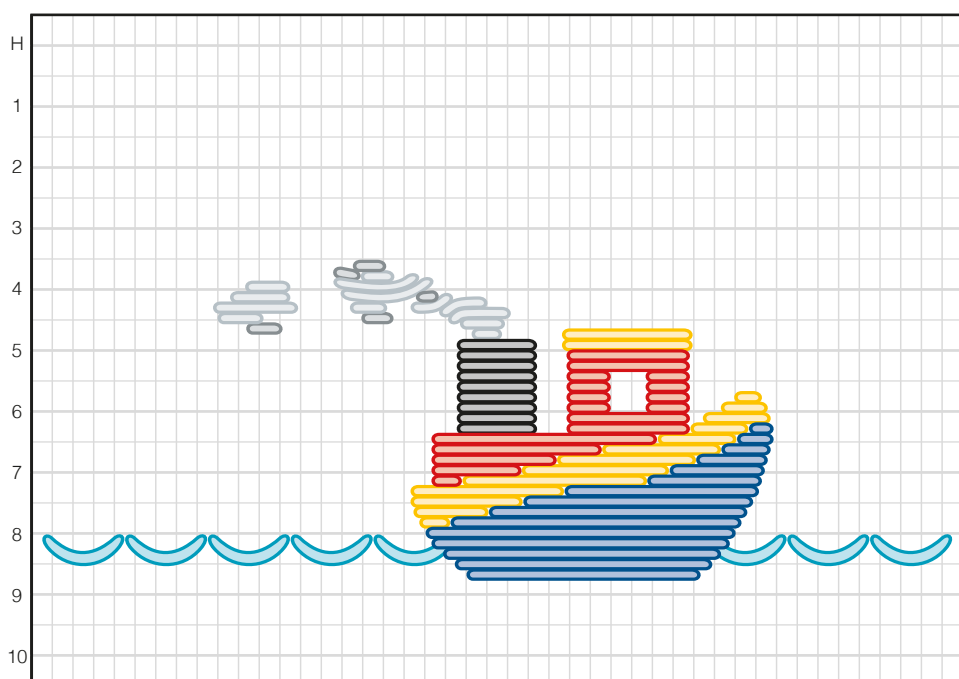
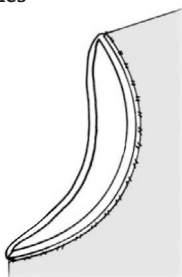

Construction, sheet 2 side 1

The following error was made:

Cutting Out

The number of straps required is four not two. Stitch the front straps on the corners and the back straps halfway between the side seam and the centre back.

Backsmocking

Rows 17 – 20. The graph should show the backsmocking as cable rows, not trellis stitch.

HOT MOCHA

Construction, sheet 1 side 2

Cutting Out

An error was made in the front insert measurement.

It should read:

Front insert: cut two, each 10cm x 56cm wide (4" x 22")

LITTLE BO PEEP

Graph, pg. 46

The following row was not marked on the graph.

Row 9 – 9 1/2. Repeat row 8 1/2 – 9 using the black thread.

CUTE 'N' CUDDLY

Graph, pg. 52

An error was made in the numbering on the graph. It should read:

Blue velour

Pleat 11 half space rows. The lowest bullion for the tug boat hull should be stitched just above row 9.

Issue 76

LULLABY

Graph, pg. 41

The graph shown is for a square yoke design, not a bishop. To smock the bishop, use the same graph down to and including row 7. Repeat row 7 half a space below.

Ignore rows 8 1/2 – 10 1/2 on the graph.

Leave three hearts between each embroidered rose spray on the smocking.

FIORE BELLO

Step by step, pg. 25

The text in the step by step instructions is correct however the photograph for step 1 is incorrect.

The image should show a total of eleven pleats picked up: Five pleats to the left, five pleats to the right plus the centre pleat.

The graph is correct for this project, showing a total of eleven pleats to be picked up.



Issue 77

LILY'S SPECIAL DAY

Requirements, pg. 10

There is an error in the requirements for the narrow white entredeux. It should read: 12.5m (13yd 20")

Pattern, sheet 3 side 2

The front blocking guide was omitted from the pattern sheet. Please follow these instructions: Tie the smocked front piece off to measure

Size 3 months: 26cm (10 1/4")

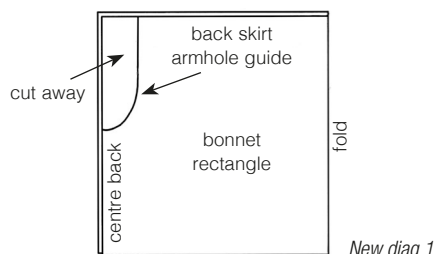

Construction, sheet 4 side 2

Step 3 Attaching the crown

Fold the bonnet rectangle in half and cut the curve for the back neck using the back skirt armhole guide (*diag 1*).

There is an error in the cutting instructions.

There is an error in the pleating instructions.

There is an error in the cutting measurements.

The following measurement was omitted from the pattern sheet:

Cutting Out

Placket: cut one 18cm x 5cm wide (7" x 2")

Timeless Treasures Tonga Bali batik 'Bali

Bubbles Flame' 112cm (44")

On the cutting layout no. 3 should be no. 8

SAIL AWAY

Construction, sheet 2 side 2

An error was made in the construction.

The correct instructions are as follows:

Step 6

Omit leaving an opening in the lining as marked on the pattern.

Step 7

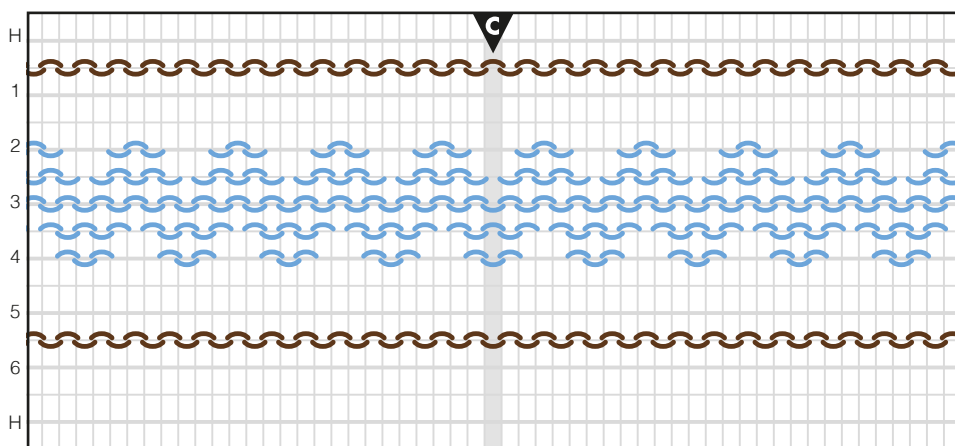
The instruction to trim the seam and clip the curves and stitch across the lower leg and around the crotch is incorrect. It should read: Once the armholes, shoulders and neckline are stitched, turn through to the right side. Stitch the lower leg seams working through the opening in the crotch. Trim the seams and clip the curves. Turn through the crotch opening. Press under the seam allowance on the crotch and handstitch.

BETWEEN FRIENDS

Graph, pg. 38

There is an error in the graph. There should be two pleats free between the peaks of the smocking, not four, as shown.

The smocking instructions on page 37 and the step by step on page 39 are correct.

Colour Key, pg. 44

There is an error in the colour key.

It should read:

D = 3326 vy lt rose

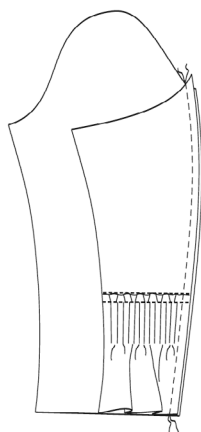

Construction, sheet 3 side 2

There is an error in diagram 5.

4. Joining the smocked sleeve panels to the under sleeve pieces

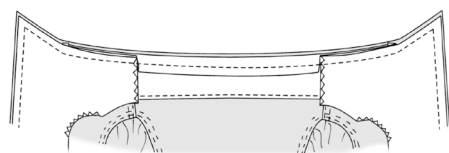
Alteration to diagram 5. The seam was shown incorrectly. Stitch the sleeve seam as shown in the following diagram:

Please make the following adjustments:

1. Move the notch 1cm ($\frac{3}{8}$ ") to the right on the upper sleeve to align with the shoulder seam.
2. The shorter seam of the under sleeve will now align with the side seam.
3. Neaten the raw edge of the front facing shoulder edge as well as the inner edge (see step 7, Collar).

Issue 88

BLUSH

Construction, sheet 2 side 1

Step 14

The conversion of 15.5cm should be $6\frac{1}{8}$ " , not $5\frac{1}{8}$ " as stated.

Align the stitchline just above the first row of smocking. Lengthen the front bodice lining 3cm ($1\frac{1}{4}$ "). Alternatively add a piece of lace to the lower edge of the front bodice lining to conceal the back of the smocking.

ANGEL

Requirements, pg. 20

There is an error in the notions:

The white satin bias binding measurement should read 2m x 20mm wide (2yd $6\frac{3}{4}$ " x $\frac{3}{4}$ ")

Construction, sheet 2 side 1

Sleeve

To form the pleat in the lower edge of the sleeve, mark 4cm ($1\frac{5}{8}$ ") to the left of the fold line.

REFLECTIONS

Construction, sheet 1 side 2

An error was made in the instructions.

They should read:

Step 2. Making the rigid purse body

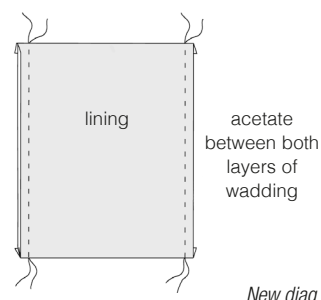
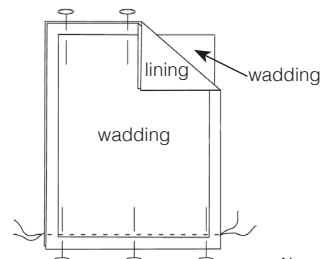
Cut two pieces of wadding and sandwich both pieces of lining between the wadding.

REFLECTIONS continued

Stitch 2mm ($\frac{1}{16}$ ") from the short ends of the wadding.

When turned through, the wadding will be between the two pieces of lining.

Trim the acetate to fit between the two layers of wadding (see diags 1 and 2 below).



We suggest that the corners of the acetate are slightly rounded to prevent wearing.

The following information was omitted:

Before stitching two rows of gathering along the upper edge of the back skirt, mark and cut away the armhole shaping using the back skirt armhole cutting guide (on sheet 2, side 1).

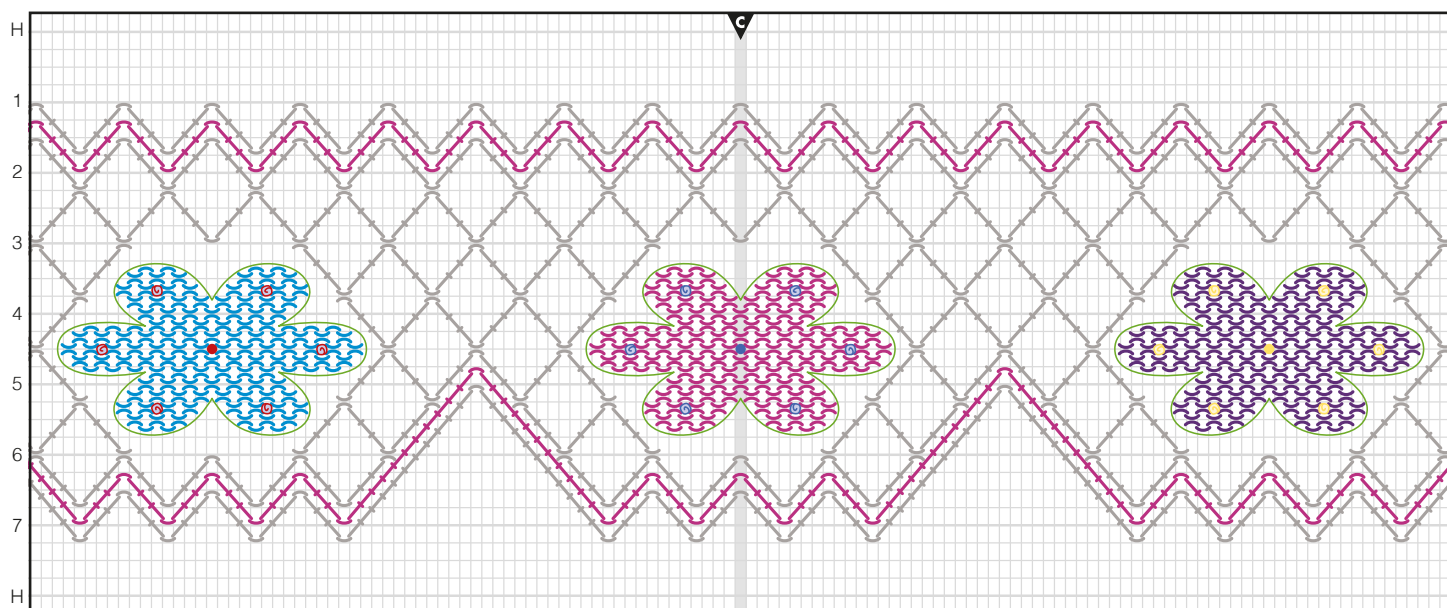
Mark the shaping using a pencil or fabric marker and cut along the marked line.

Unpick the pleating threads for 3.5cm (1 3/8") at each side.

Construction, sheet 1 side 1

Cutting Out

The liftout pattern contains only the cutting information for the skirt tiers for a size 8.

Following are the cutting requirements for all sizes:

Size 6: cut two, each

16.5cm x 70cm wide (6 1/2" x 27 1/2")

Size 8: cut two, each

19.5cm x 70cm wide (7 3/4" x 27 1/2")

Size 10: cut three, each

The petticoat front bodice and gown front bodice labels have been transposed.

The petticoat should have no finished bound neckline.

TWICE AS NICE

Preparation and Pleating, pg. 41

Pleat 9 full space rows (including two holding rows) with the top holding row 5mm (1/4") from the upper raw edge.

Unpick the pleating threads for 6cm (2 3/8") at each side.

Smocking, pg. 41

Count the pleats and mark the centre valley.

Row 1 - 1 3/4. Beginning at the centre two pleats on row 1 with an over cable, work three step wave down to row 1 3/4, under cable, three step wave up to row 1. Continue to the end of the row. Turn the work, return to the centre and complete the row.

Rows 1 1/4 - 2 1/4. Following the graph for colour placement, work a second row of three step wave between rows 1 1/4 - 2 and a third row between rows 1 1/2 - 2 1/4.

Row 2 1/4 - 3. Work a mirror image of row 1 1/2 - 2 1/4, forming diamonds.

Rows 3 - 6 3/4. Carefully following the graph for stitch placement and beginning and ending threads on the back as required, work three step wave as indicated.

Row 4 3/4 - 7. Beginning at the centre two pleats on row 6 1/4 with an over cable, work three steps down to row 7, under cable, three steps up to row 6 1/4, over cable, three steps down to row 7, under cable, eleven steps up to row 4 3/4, over cable, eleven steps down to row 7, under cable, three steps up to row 6 1/4, over cable, three steps down to row 7, under cable, three steps up to row 6 1/4. Continue working three step, eleven step wave combination to the end of the row. Turn the work and complete the row.

TWICE AS NICE *continued*

Row 5 - 7 1/4. Following the graph for thread colour, repeat the previous row.

Flowers

Each flower is centered in the unsmocked area between rows 3 and 6 and is worked with four strands of thread.

Begin each flower at the left hand edge on row 4 1/2. Work 27 cable stitches in the first row. Carefully following the graph and embroidery key, work the upper half of each flower, then the lower half.

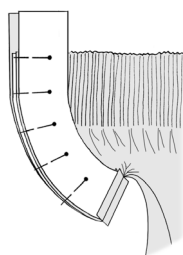

To shape the front

The following information was omitted from the construction text:

On the upper edge of the front and back skirt pattern piece, measure across 2.5cm (1") from the existing centre foldline and mark.

Rule a line parallel with the foldline for 8cm (3 1/8") down the skirt. Fold the pattern piece in half and pin along the marked line, forming a pleat.

Open out the pattern piece and position over the smocked fabric, aligning the centre of the upper stitchline with the centre front of the first row of smocking.

Ensuring the grainlines are aligned, mark the front shaping onto the fabric with the water-soluble marker. Cut out.

The front yoke pattern piece should not be traced on the fold and the front yokes should not be cut on the fold.

The information on the pattern piece should read: Cut 4 white cotton broadcloth

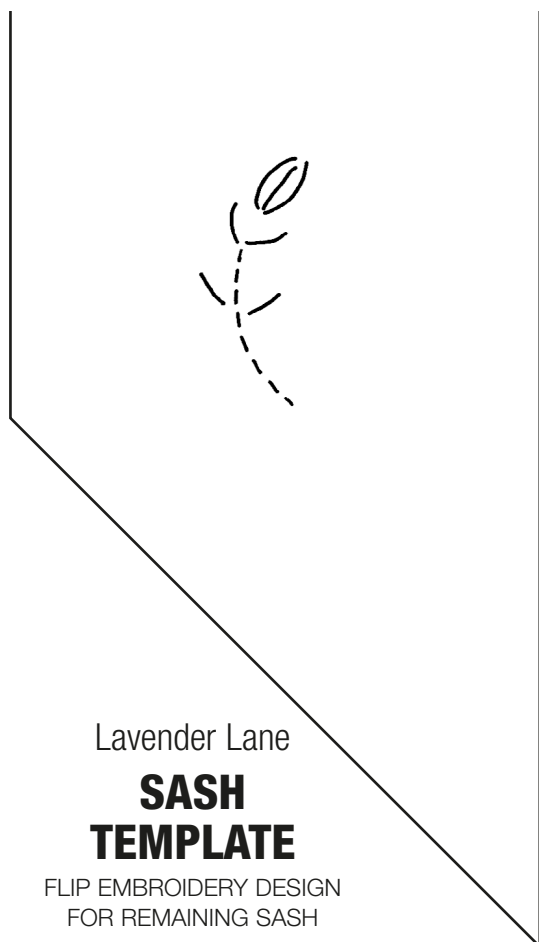

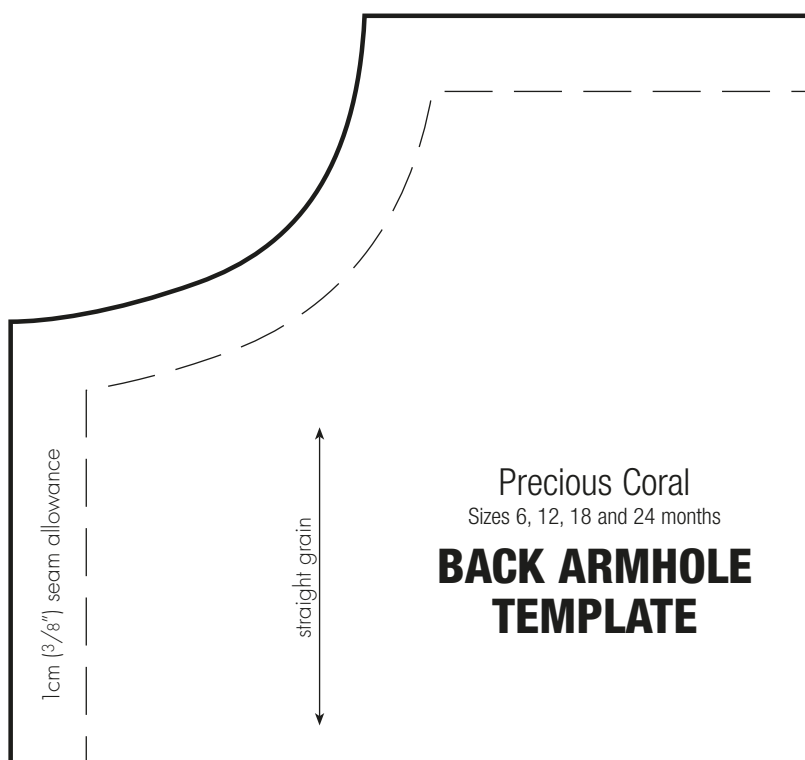
